

The gun violence in Philadelphia is being within the pandemic a huge spread virus as well.

The amount of incidents involving guns are cause of concerns for many families who still are recovering from a global pandemic. amid rising gun violence in other American cities, including Chicago, Kansas City and New York. Experts differ on the cause, although some attribute it to rising feelings of despair amid the ongoing coronavirus pandemic.

The numbers of homicides in the city of brotherly love is astronomical. To this point in the year the count is Shootings are at 1,107 – up well over 400 the City hasn't seen number this high in nearly 30 years. Councilmembers, anti-violent activist, clergy members and City Police members have been meeting to try to

"We are on a pace today for 2,000 shootings this year in Philadelphia, and that is simply unacceptable," said Council President Darrell L. Clarke, a longtime advocate prevention laws. "This is an all-hands-on-deck moment perts and the public on what in our city, and City Council will do its part."

> "Save a life, Turn in a gun." This program allows citizens of the community to turn in guns no questions asked. The city is also asking residents to exercise "home gun checks," assuring that their firearms are accounted for at all times.

33 percent. One hundred victims under age 18 have been shot this year - a 70 percent increase over last year.

There were 25 people involved in shooting last week two 11-year old boys in two separate incidents as well as Photo Courtesy of a 6-year old girl and a 7year old boy who was caught in the crossfire.

"People in our neighborhoods know where the guns are," Qayyum said. "We're asking them to do the right thing, and bring guns they find in their homes, and turn them in."

"It is extremely important in the middle of a gun epidemic in the midst of a pandemic for all of us - clergy, police and community – to work together to use every means necessary to reduce the gun violence," said Rev. Gregory Holston, pastor at Janes Memorial United Methodist Church in Germantown.

As we creep closer to a normal life style we must all do our part in the community to try to keep the homicide number from climbing and further and also protect the many youth who will be engaging in online learning but also be in the neighborhoods that have claimed the lives of nearly 400 people this year alone.



As I walked into the store front on Rising Sun Ave, a sign stood in front of the door, "\$1,000 Special: LLC Formation, Credit Repair, 1 on 1 tips/tricks." process that could take up to 6 months.

The shop was open from Monday August 17- Saturday August 22. Following the closure of business Saturday, Qadir hosted a ca-

tered dinner for some of his through visitation, and so closest friends and family to much more. To see you celebrate the success of the shop as well as to look forward to the times ahead. Before everyone headed friend, Love Williams, got everyone's attention to say a few words about Qadir and the impact he has had on his life:

GOVERNOR WOLF CALLS FOR LEGALIZATION OF CANNABIS



On September 3rd, Governor Tom Wolf and Lt. Governor John Fetterman called on the state legislature to pass legislation that would legalize adult-use marijuana. The end of prohibition on cannabis would provide a much needed revenue boost to the state to help deal with the crippling economic toll that COVID has placed on the state. In addition, funds would be redirected to restorative justice programs to help repair the damage that cannabis criminalization has caused.

"Now more than ever, we see a desperate need for the economic boost cannabis legalization can provide. So

today I am proposing we legalize adult-use cannabis here in Pennsylvania with a portion of the revenue going toward existing small business grants," Gov. Wolf said. "Half of these grants would be earmarked for historically disadvantaged businesses, many of which have had difficulties obtaining other assistance because of systemic issues.

"The other portion of the revenue will go toward restorative justice programs that give priority to repairing the harm done to crime victims and communities as a result of cannabis criminalization."

Lt. Governor Fetterman

hammered down on the need for legislation to provide restorative justice.

"It has been nearly a year since Governor Wolf and I urged the legislature to act on immediate decriminalization and start the discussion about legalization," Lt. Governor Fetterman said. "Now more than ever, we must stop prosecuting people for doing something that most Pennsylvanians don't even think should be illegal."

Currently, there are 11 eleven states that have legalized weed, and legalization has given a huge boost to their economies.

"Some states that have legalized adult-use cannabis have received millions in additional revenue," Gov. Wolf said. "In Washington state, adult-use cannabis brought in \$319 million in tax revenue in 2018. In Colorado, that figure topped \$266 million, and provided

the city of Aurora with \$900,000 to open a space for people experiencing homelessness. And these figures don't count the secondary economic benefits of new businesses opening."

"Communities across our commonwealth are suffering," said Sen. Sharif Street, who joined the governor and the lt. governor at the event. "Government has a responsibility to provide for and protect Pennsylvanians without cutting vital support systems or levying new taxes during a pandemic. After years of disparate enforcement of marijuana laws, which drives mass incarceration, social justice reform must be central to any policy on adult use. I'm proud to support Governor Wolf in By Staff this effort."

The Governor has asked the legislature to take immediate action to decriminalize possession of small amounts, and change possession from a misdemeanor to a summary offense.

In September 2019, the Governor did a statewide listening tour on the issues and came to the finding that the majority of Pennsylvanians favor legalization. And that the following steps needed to be taken moving forward; a referendum on legalization, decriminalization and expungement of small possession convictions.

"The time has come to legalize adult-use cannabis in Pennsylvania," Gov. Wolf said. "It will help our economic recovery, it will help Pennsylvania families and it will help make our criminal justice system fairer."

While schools have decided to continue to keep its online presence, learning can still occur. At 15 years old a young man started a business and taught other leaders.




